

LETTER FROM PASTOR

When my daughter, Lola, was younger, like many children, she had a favorite movie that she liked to watch on repeat. While I am a self-proclaimed "movie buff," I must admit that my tolerance for watching the same movie on repeat was almost non-existent. But, out of love, I would restart whatever her new favorite movie was. Then, for my sanity, I would leave and go find something else to do.

After a few weeks, and a few dozen times of hearing the film, I would usually give in and sit down to watch the feature a second time. To my amazement, I would be amazed at how little I remembered! While the film had been on repeat, I was only catching pieces of it. So, to my surprise, there were often whole scenes I had completely forgotten about!

I cannot help but wonder how many of us have similar experiences with the Bible. We catch a verse here and a story there but rarely do we dive into a book or the entirety of the Scriptures from beginning to end. Does it matter that we don't know what comes before or after?

That question led me to create our next sermon series, starting October 17th, called "Doers of the Word." In the "Doers" series we will explore the five short chapters of the book of James from beginning to end. This method, I believe, will help us gain a greater understanding of the author's over-arching purpose.

So, perhaps you are wondering: "Why James?" Not only is James short enough to study in the five weeks of the series, but I was drawn to this book by one scholar's summary of the "letter." In the IVP Bible Background commentary, Craig S. Keener says that the author of the book had attempted to address the socio-economic tensions of his day. It seems to me that James' audience found themselves wondering what it meant to be "kingdom people" when the situation of the world around them was "pulling" them in different directions.

This idea, I believe, is one <u>many</u> of us can relate to! Whether it is politics, the health crisis, economic uncertainty or what sports team you are rooting for, it is easy to get "sucked into" the high emotions of the world today. How do we be "Doers of the Word" in a world like this? Hopefully, throughout this series we will find out!

I want to remind everyone that I am offering a "Message Engagement" class this quarter. I believe this class will provide us the perfect place to talk about what we are learning and how it applies to our lives. I hope to see you there!

STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE - Budget Year to Date August 2021

2021 Budget:	\$ 245,565		
General Fund Receipts	\$	164,425	67.0 %
General Fund Expenses	\$	147,608	60.1 %
Receipts over Expenses	\$	16,817	

The church expenditures year-to-date are under budget by \$16,920.23. Income is under budget by \$103.19.

The year-to-date budget surplus is \$16,817.

All of the ministry expenses are at or under budget except for Stewardship and Finance. S&F is slightly over budget since we did not budget for on-line processing fees for donations to the church, but this will be a relatively minor budget expense. Mission payments are on track year to date.
